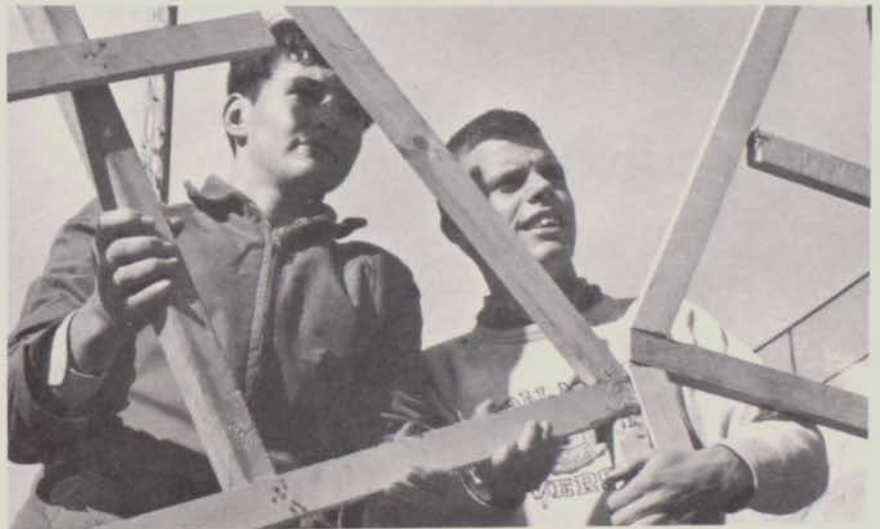

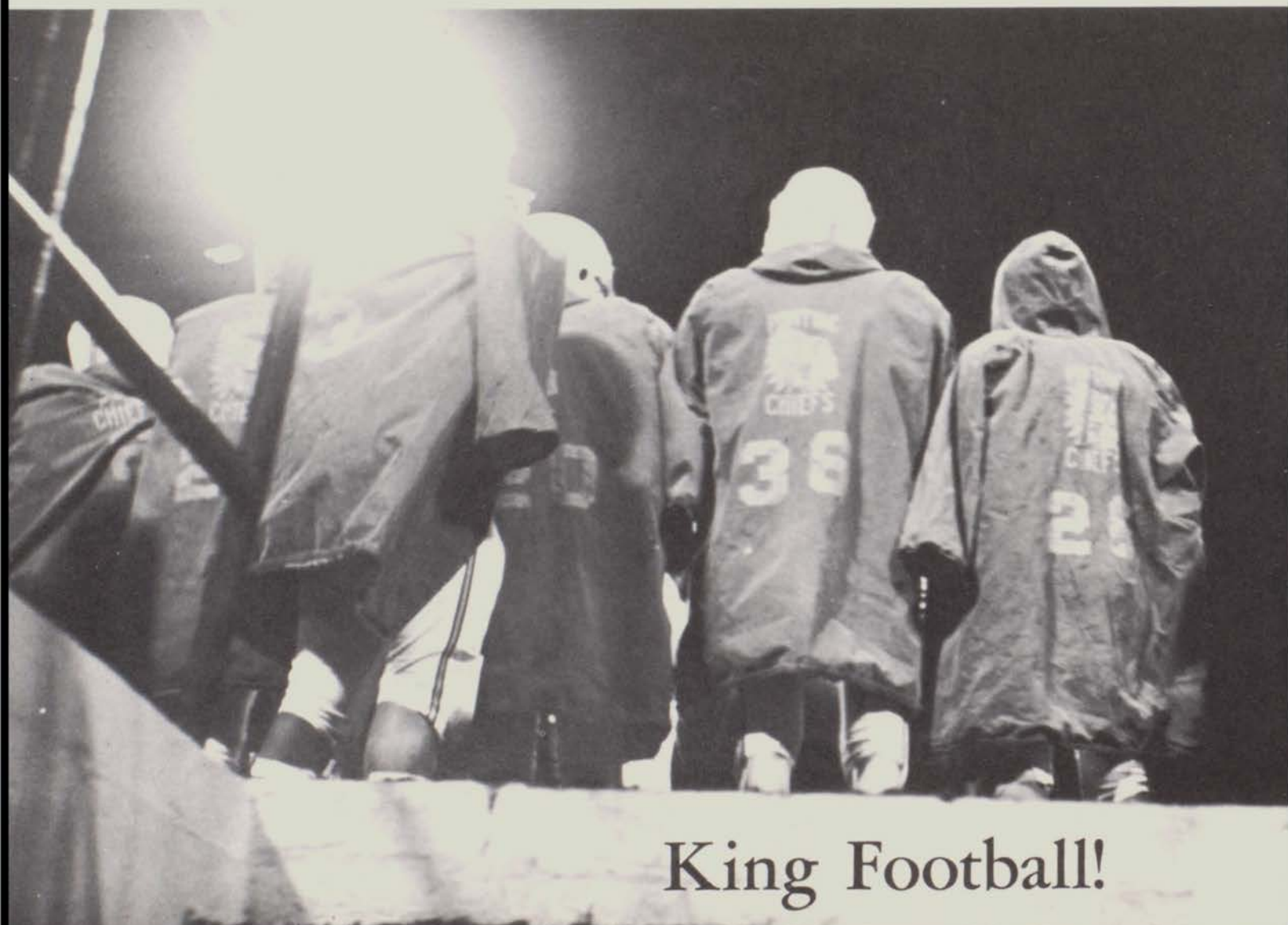

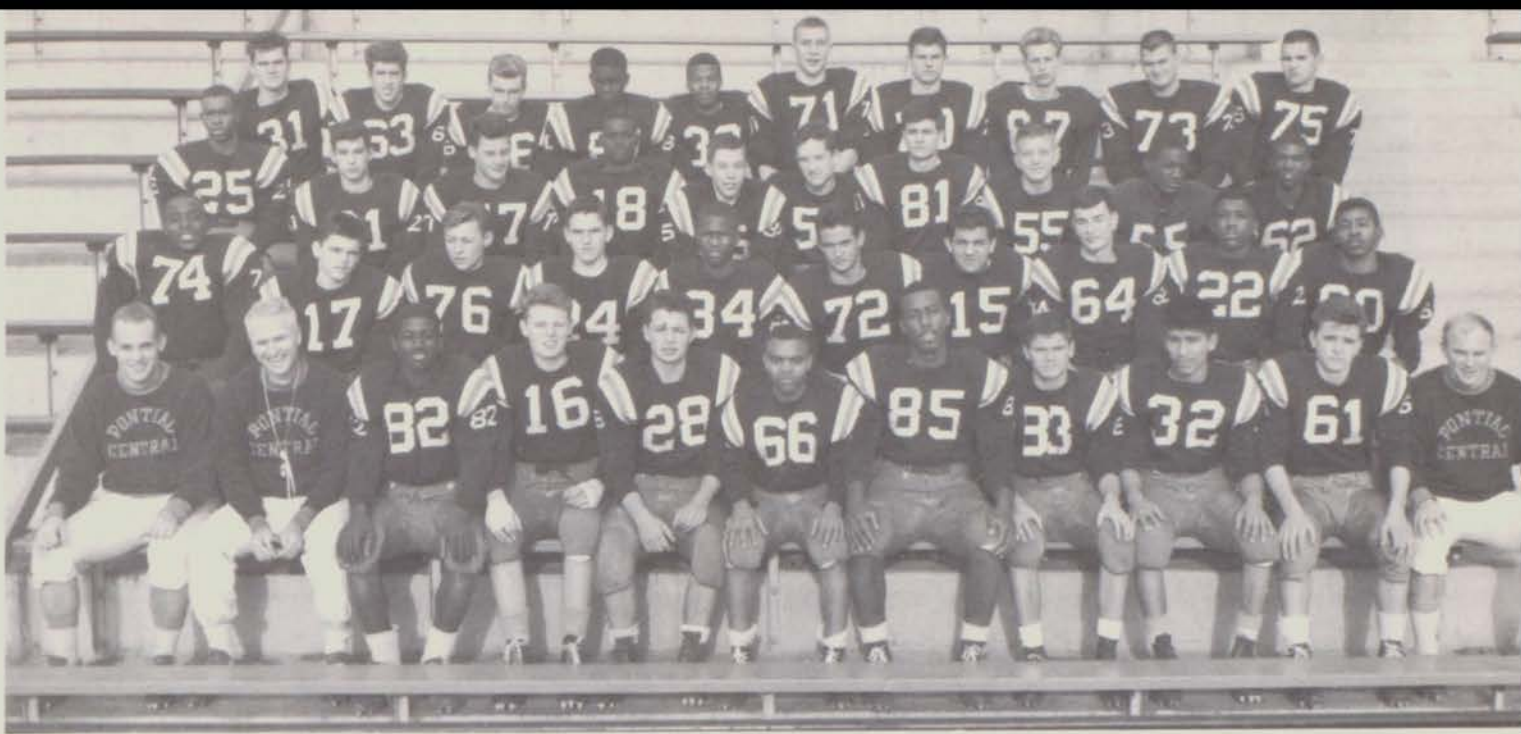

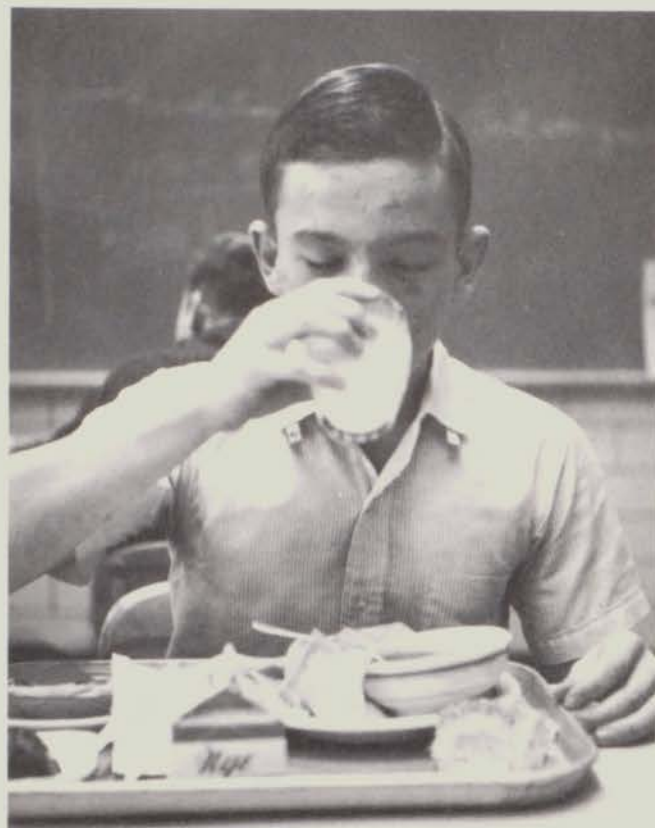

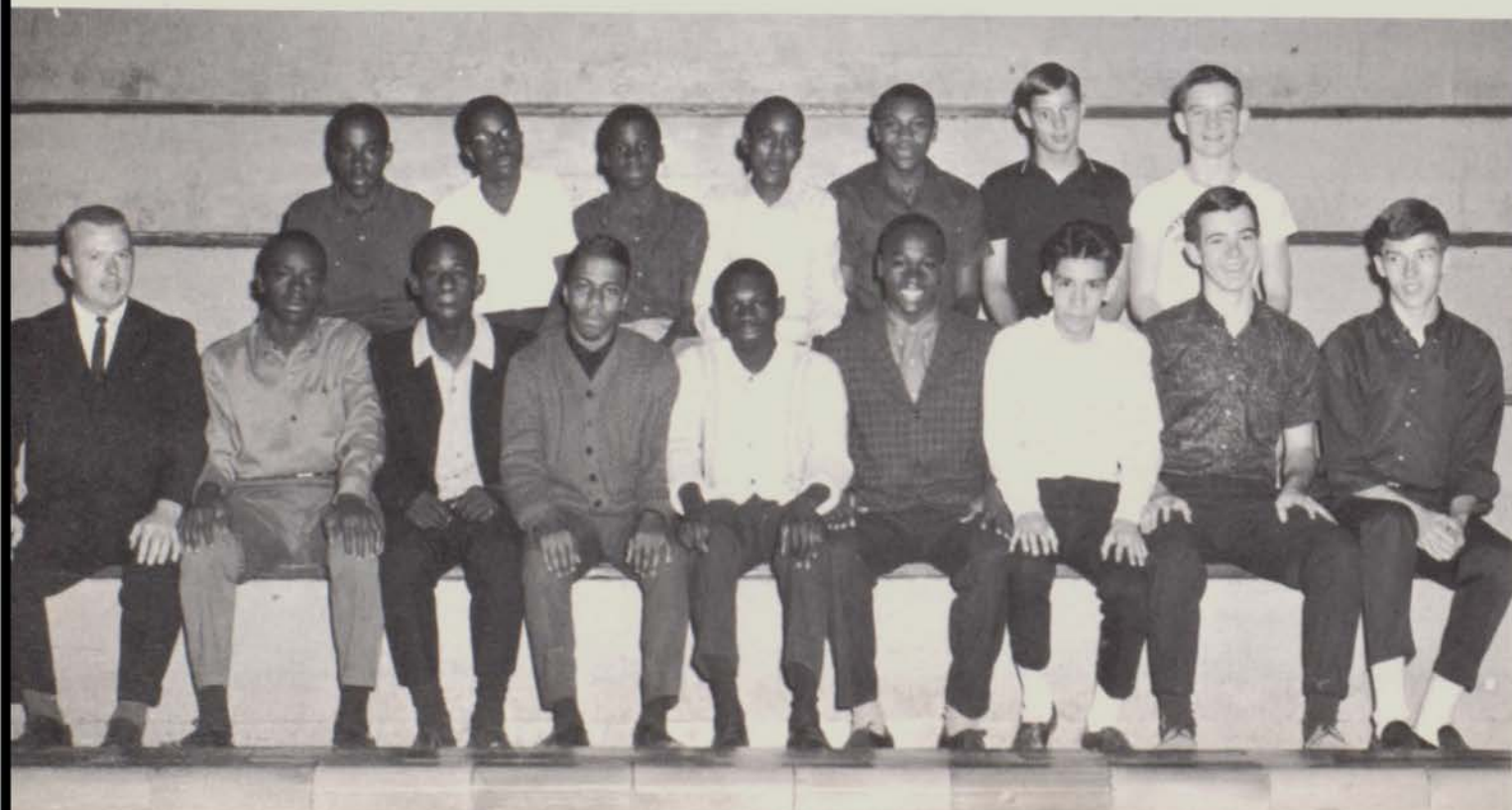

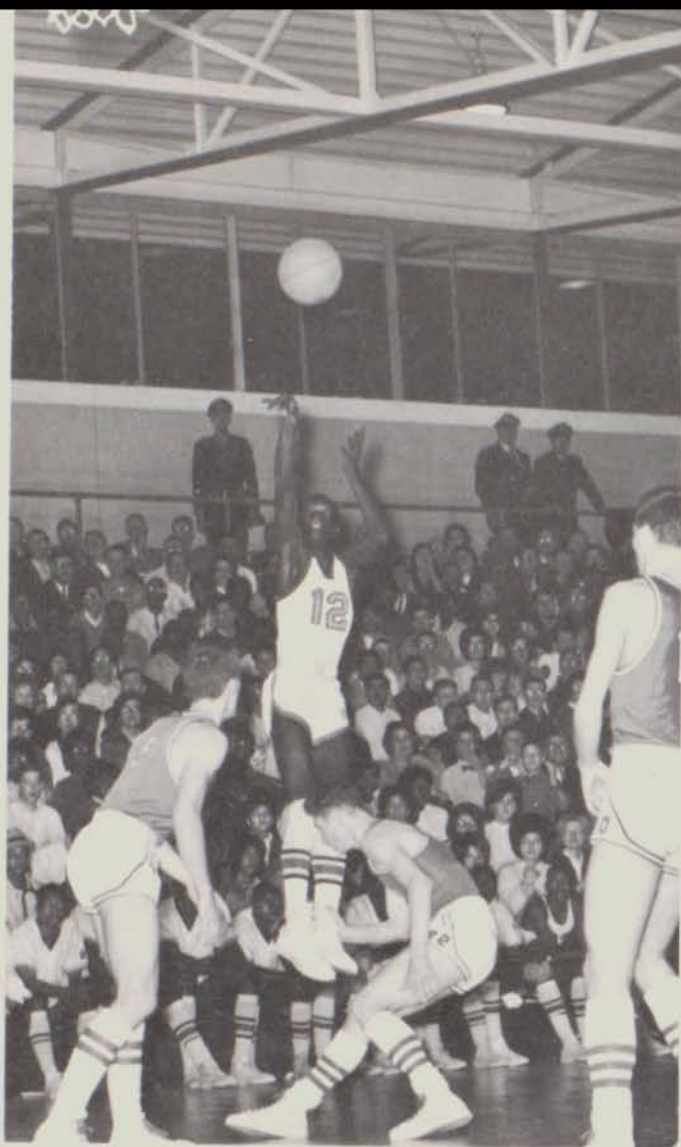

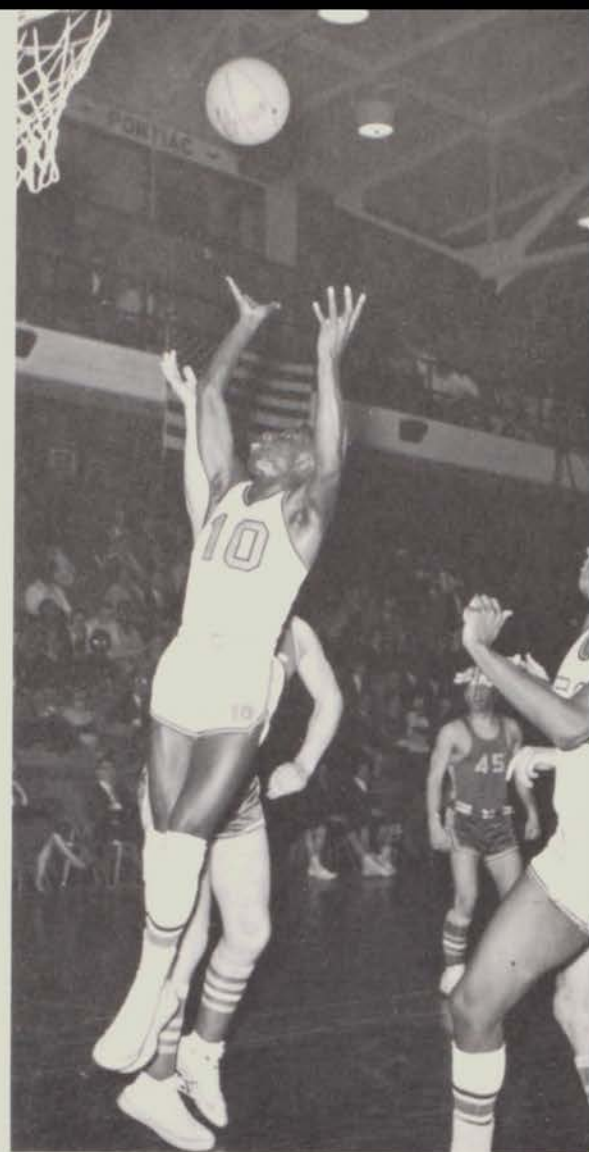

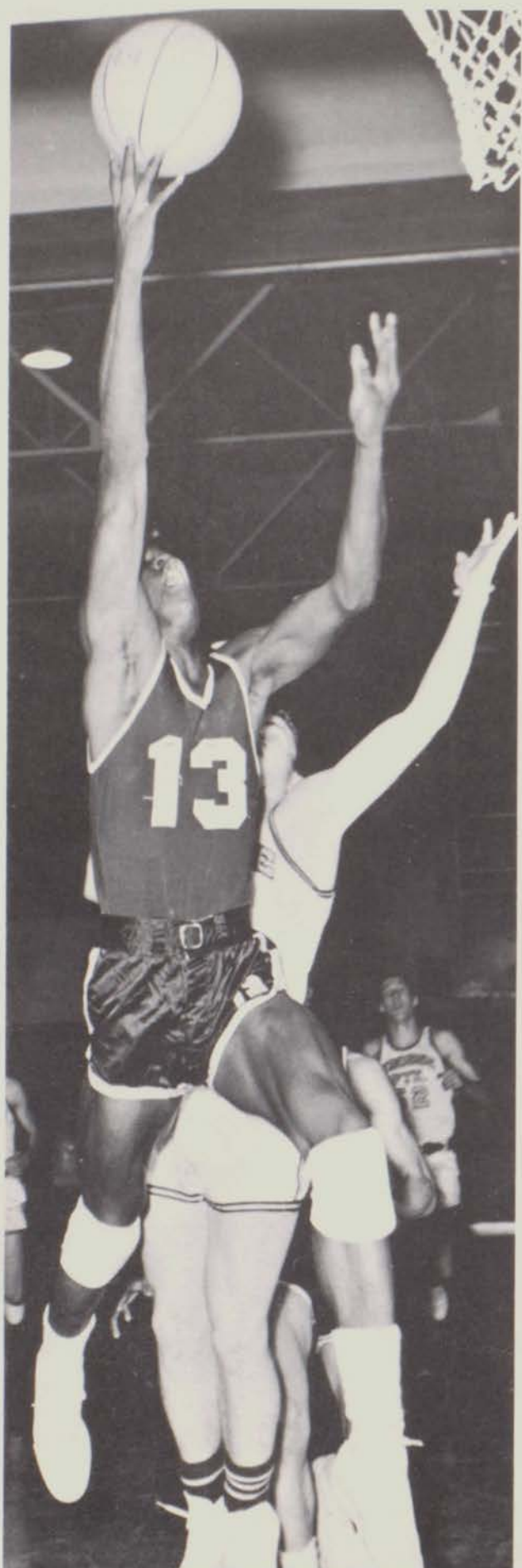

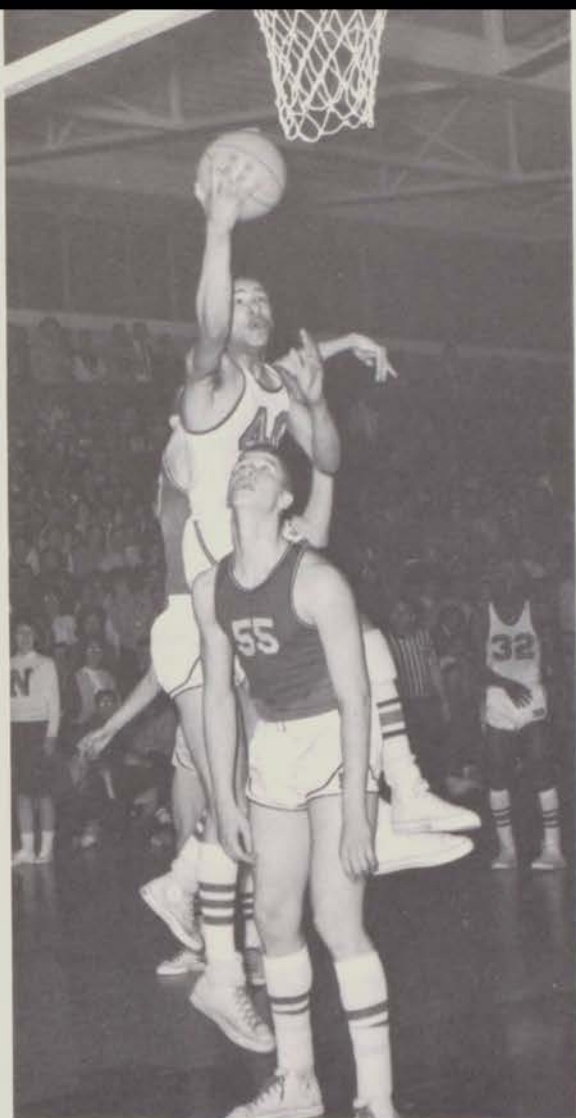

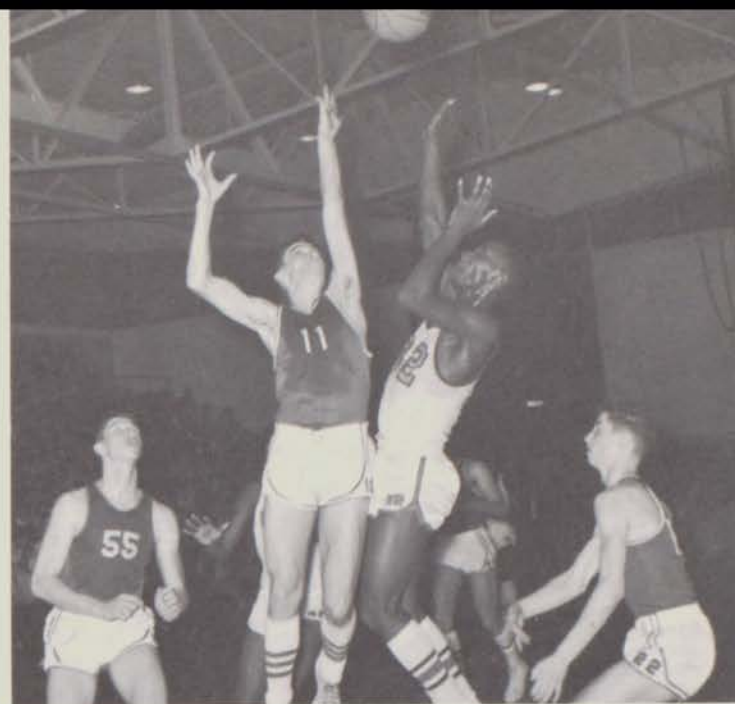

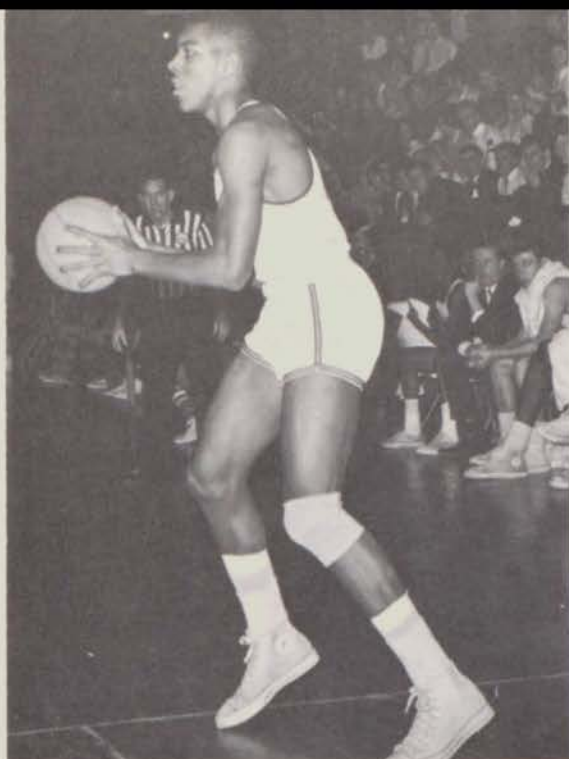

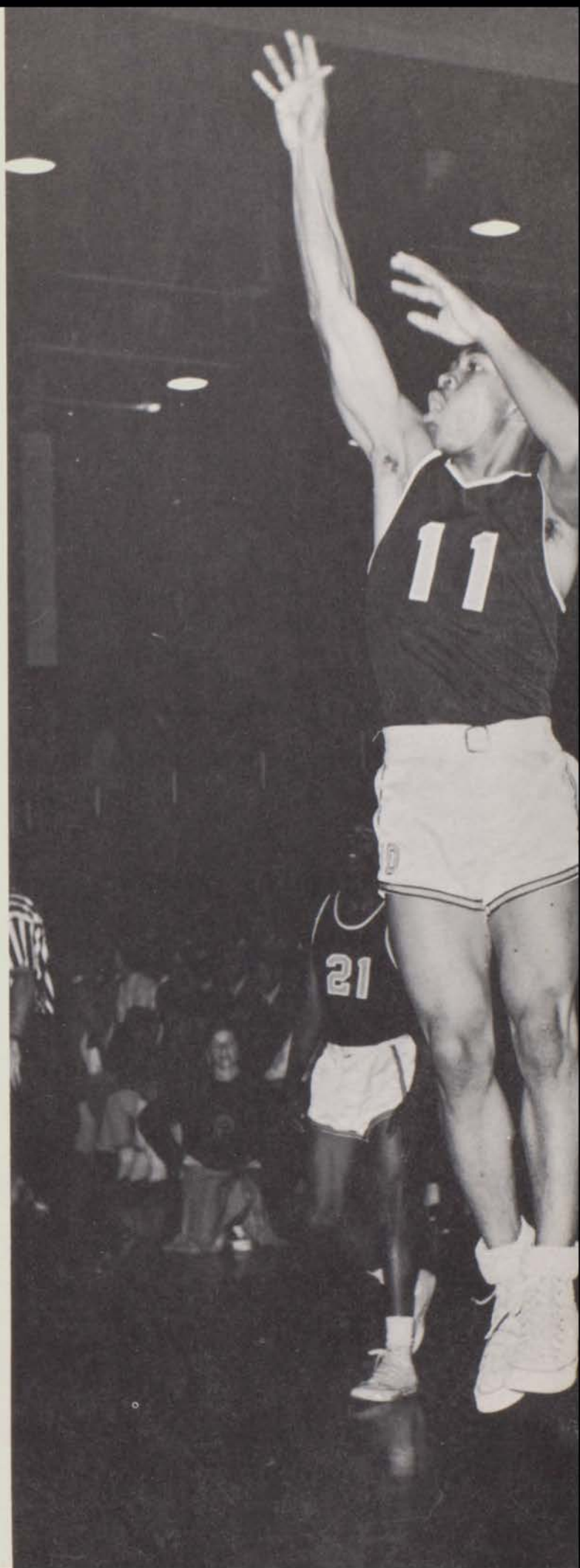

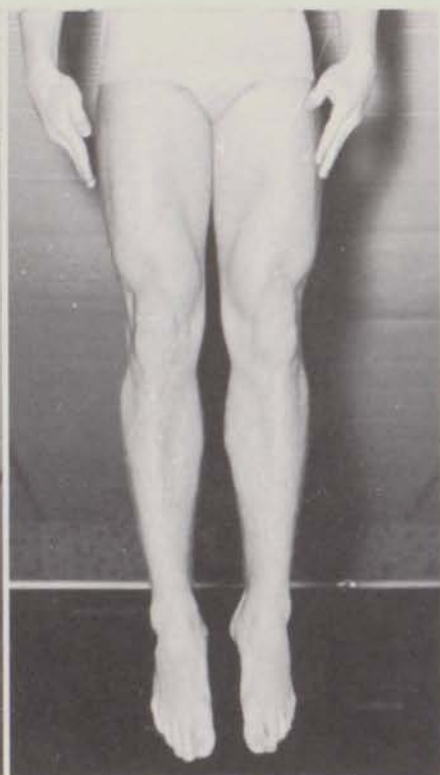

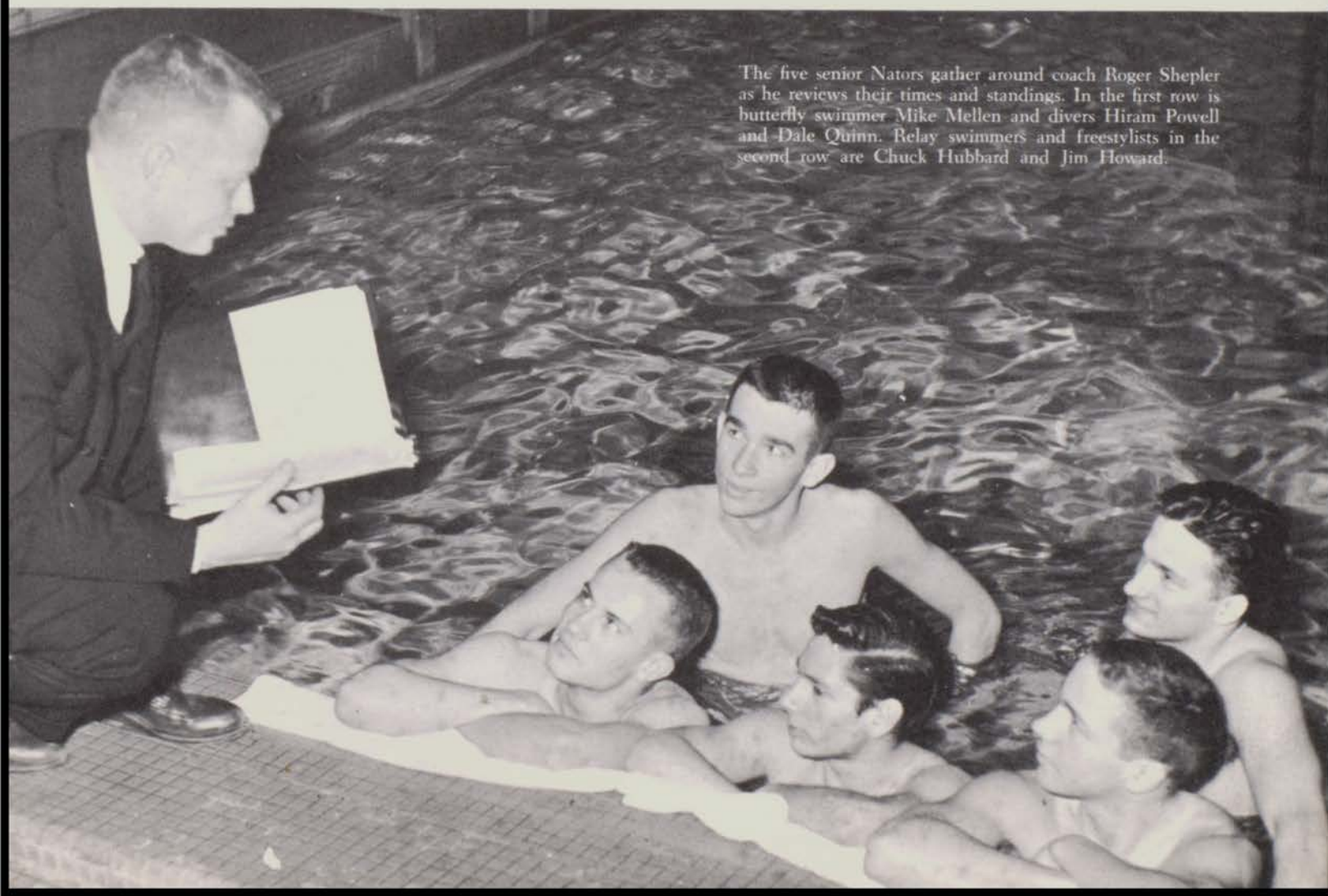
This year's captain was Jim Howard and the team manager was Chris Fitzgerald. The squad looks forward to a successful season in '64 with 21 promising swimmers.

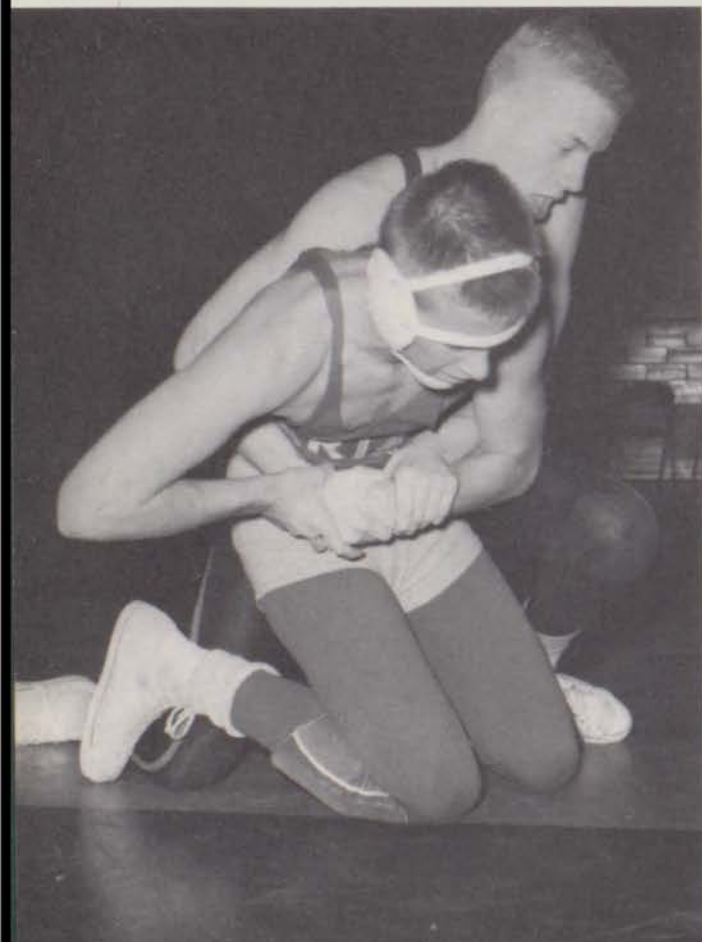

## Matmen stage late splurt to end successful season

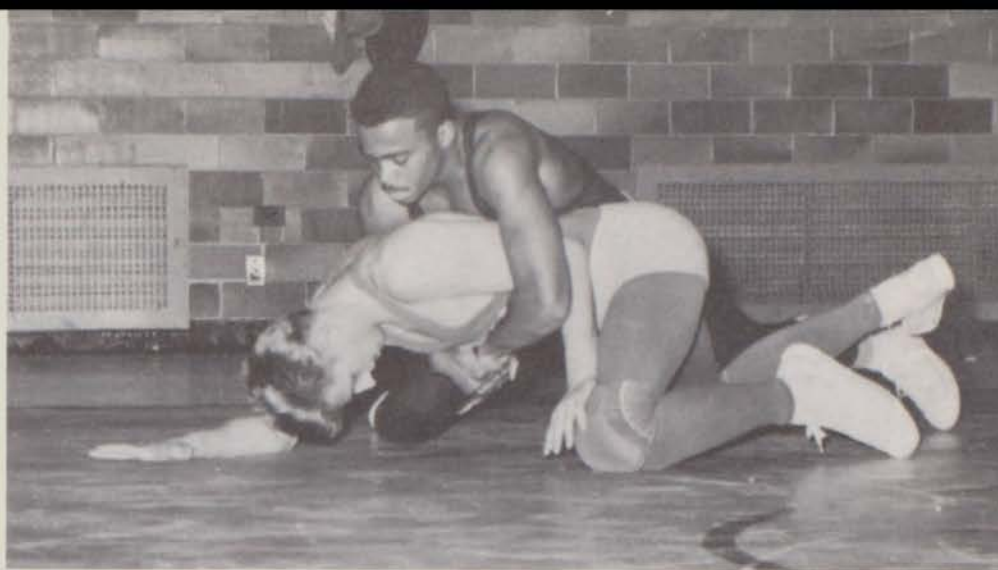

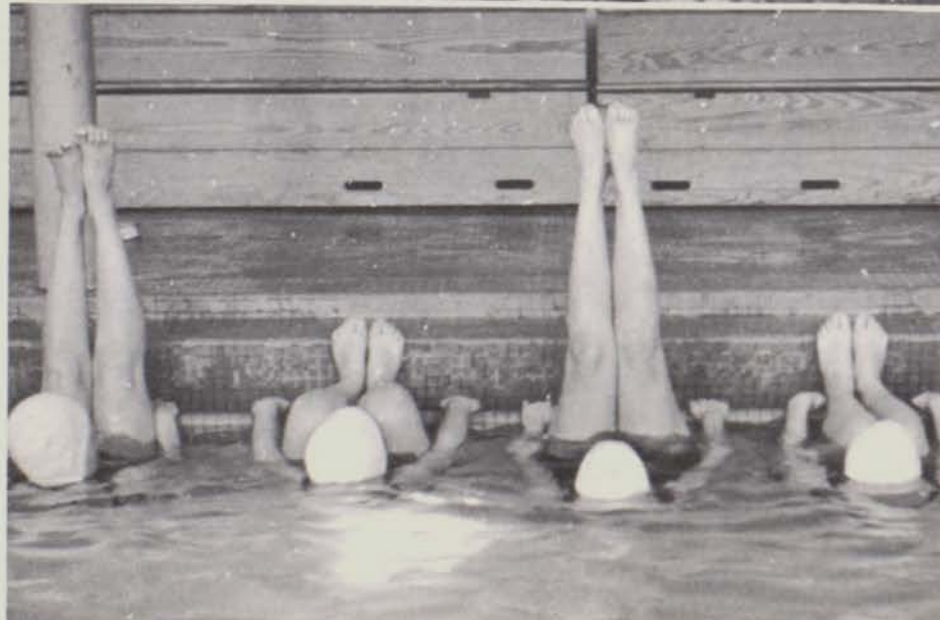

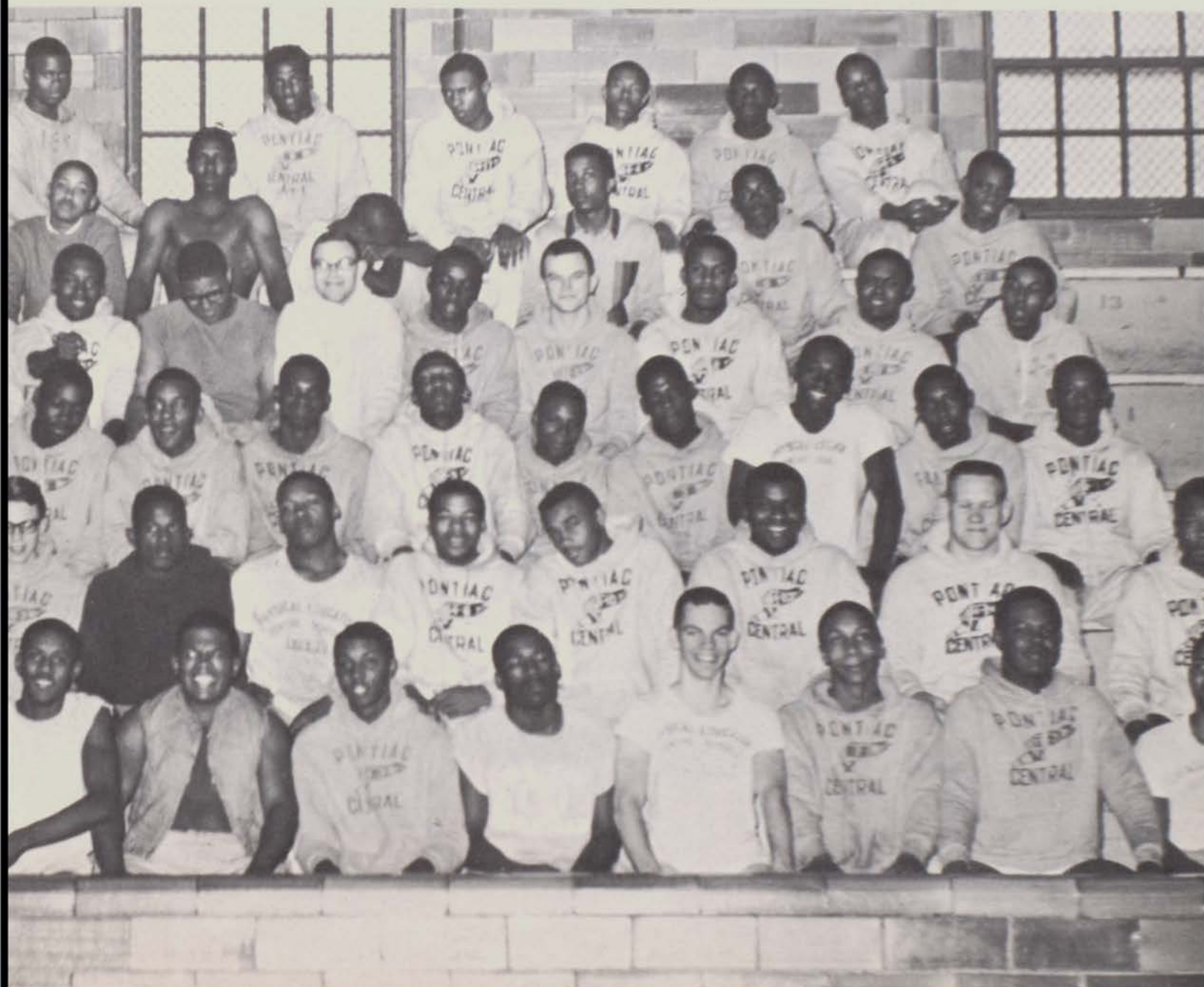
## blaze to another successful season

# Five letters boost netters

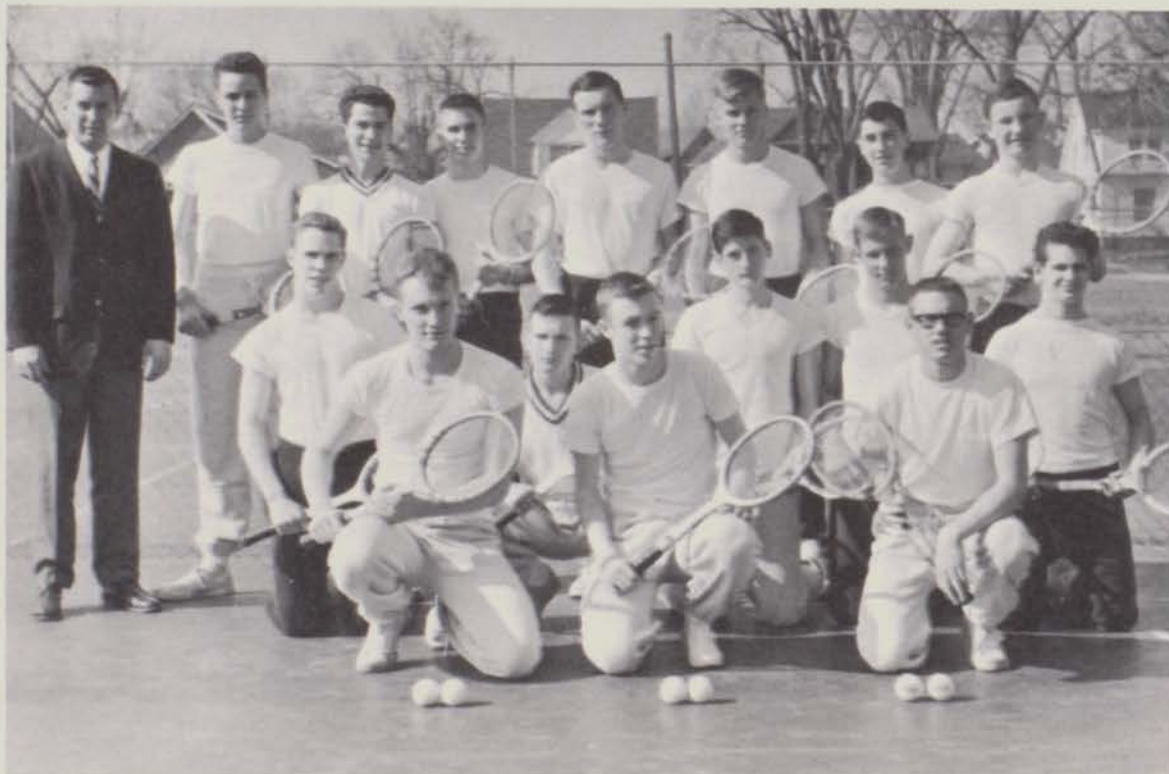
Coaching the tennis team for his second year, John Zimmerle is optimistic about this year's squad.

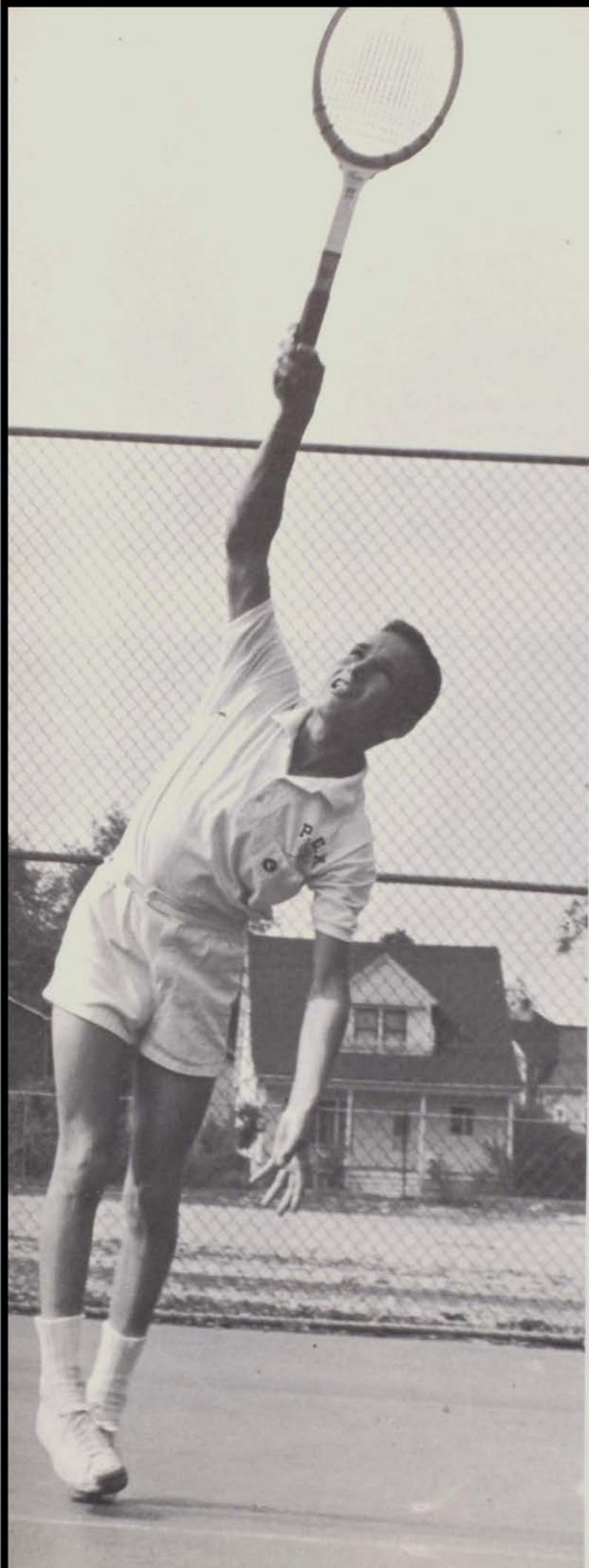

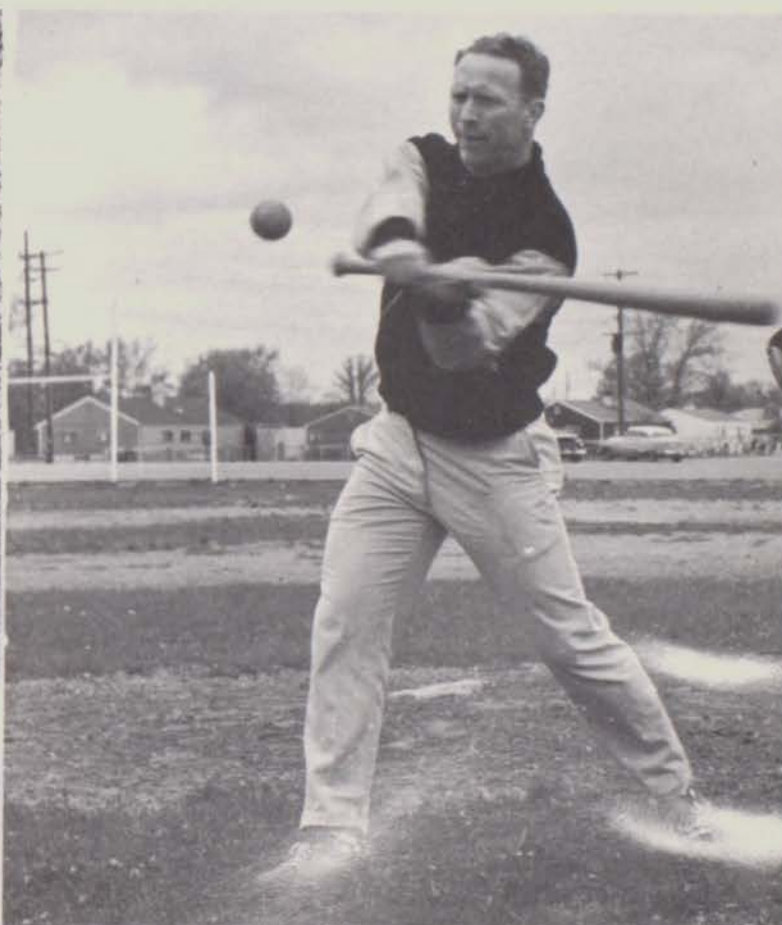

The counseling department, under the direction of Donald McMillan, constantly seeks the best program through which students may learn to assume the responsibility for intelligent self-direction. To guide, instruct, and inform is the counselors' main concern.

One aspect of their work involves the testing program. Several aptitude and interest tests, such as the National Educational Development Test for tenth graders, the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test for both eleventh and twelfth graders, are offered during the year.

These tests provide the students with a purposeful means of understanding himself and his needs. Once these basic needs are recognized, the student and counselor are able to plan together an appropriate curriculum.

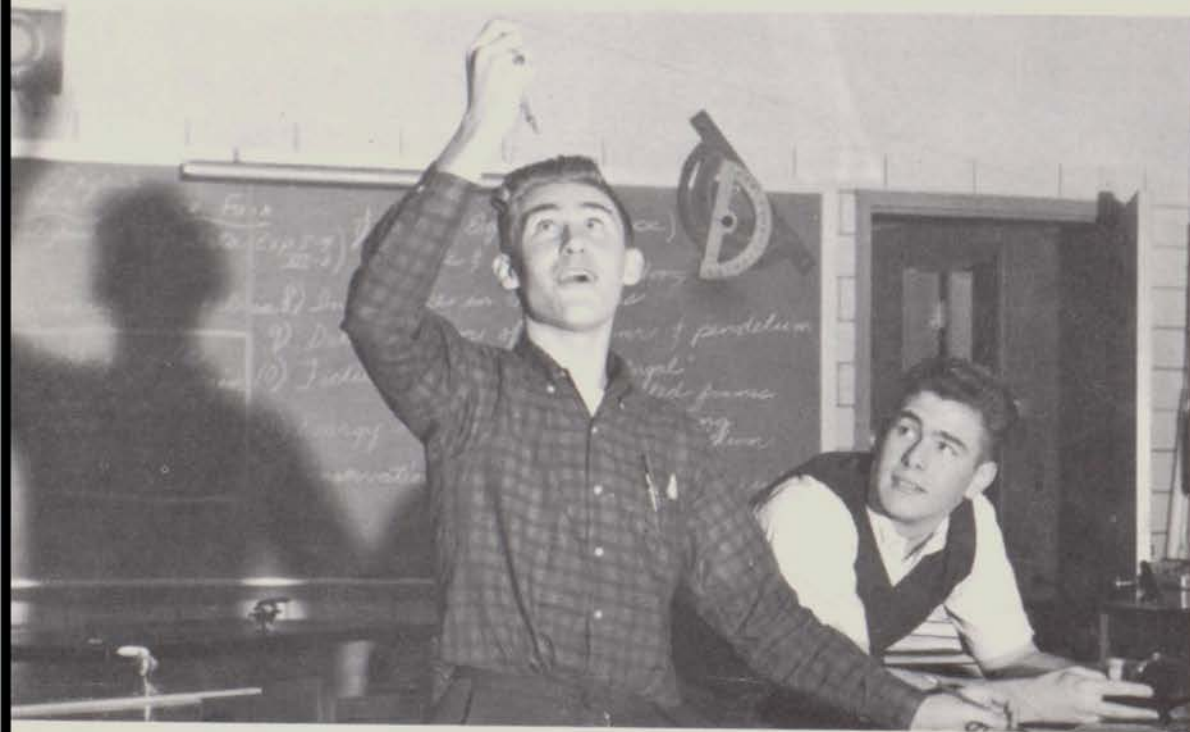

"The mathematics curriculum of Pontiac Central has as its goal a better fulfillment of the needs of students at all ability levels," states Joseph Blank, department head.

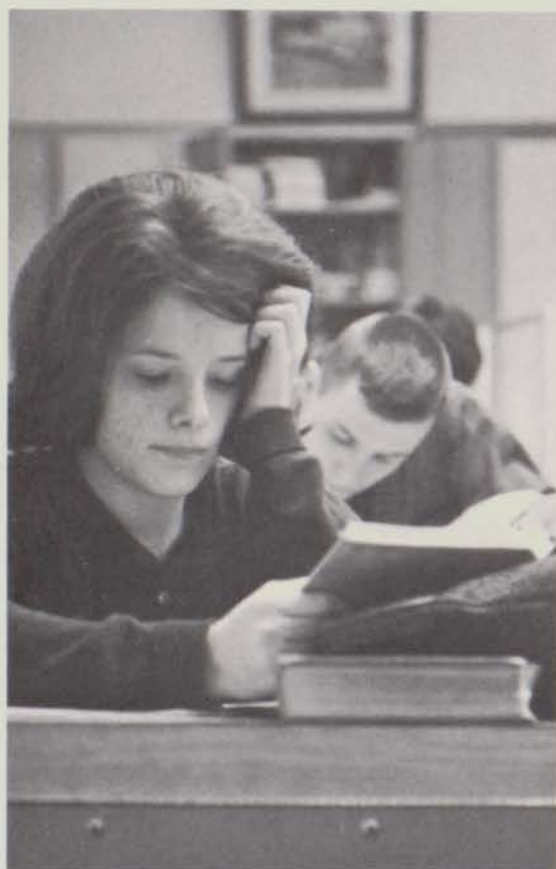

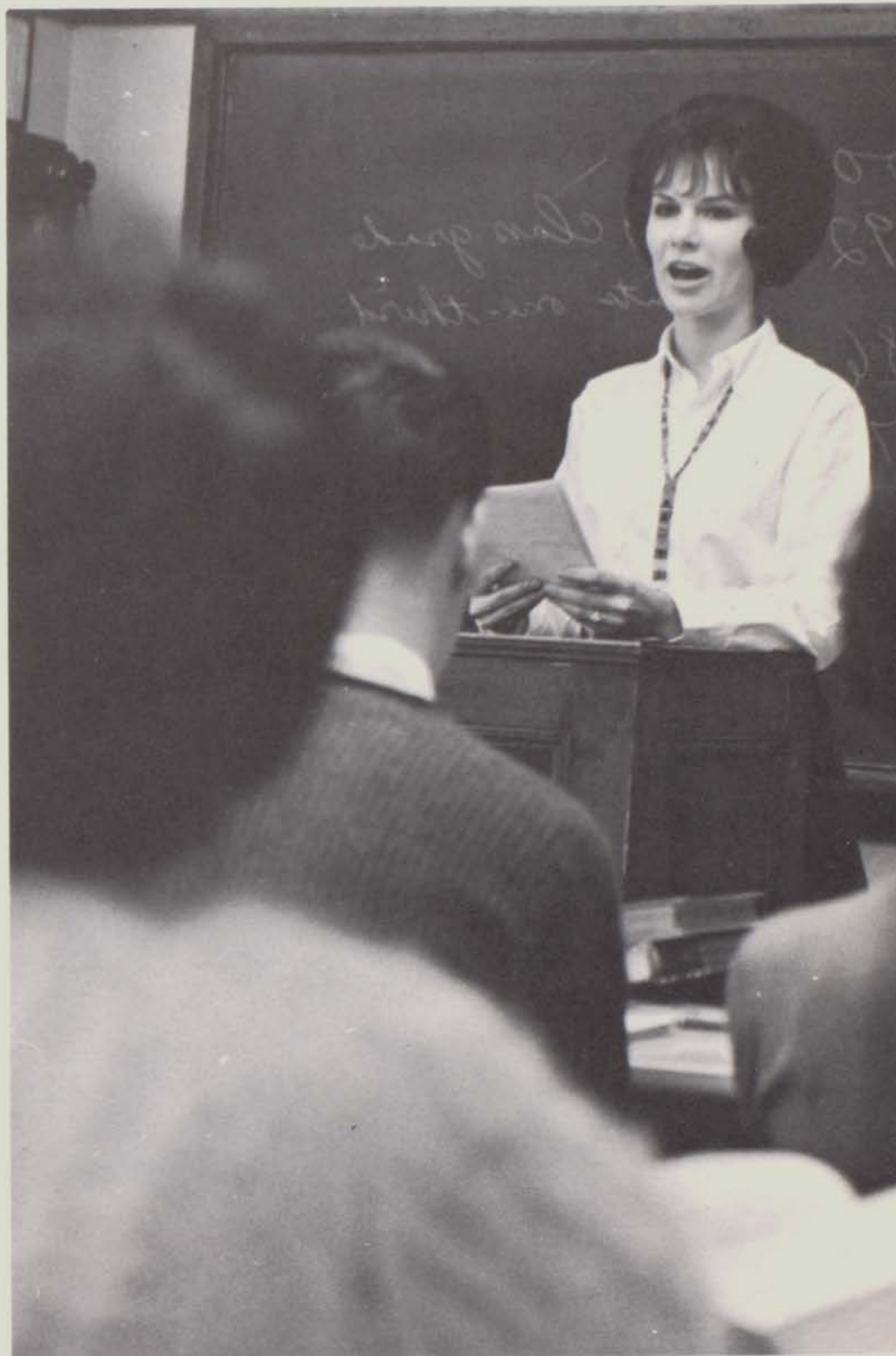
An invaluable link of the chain is found in the thought provoking phases of foreign language and literature. With such links, the chain is strengthened into a strong line of communication.

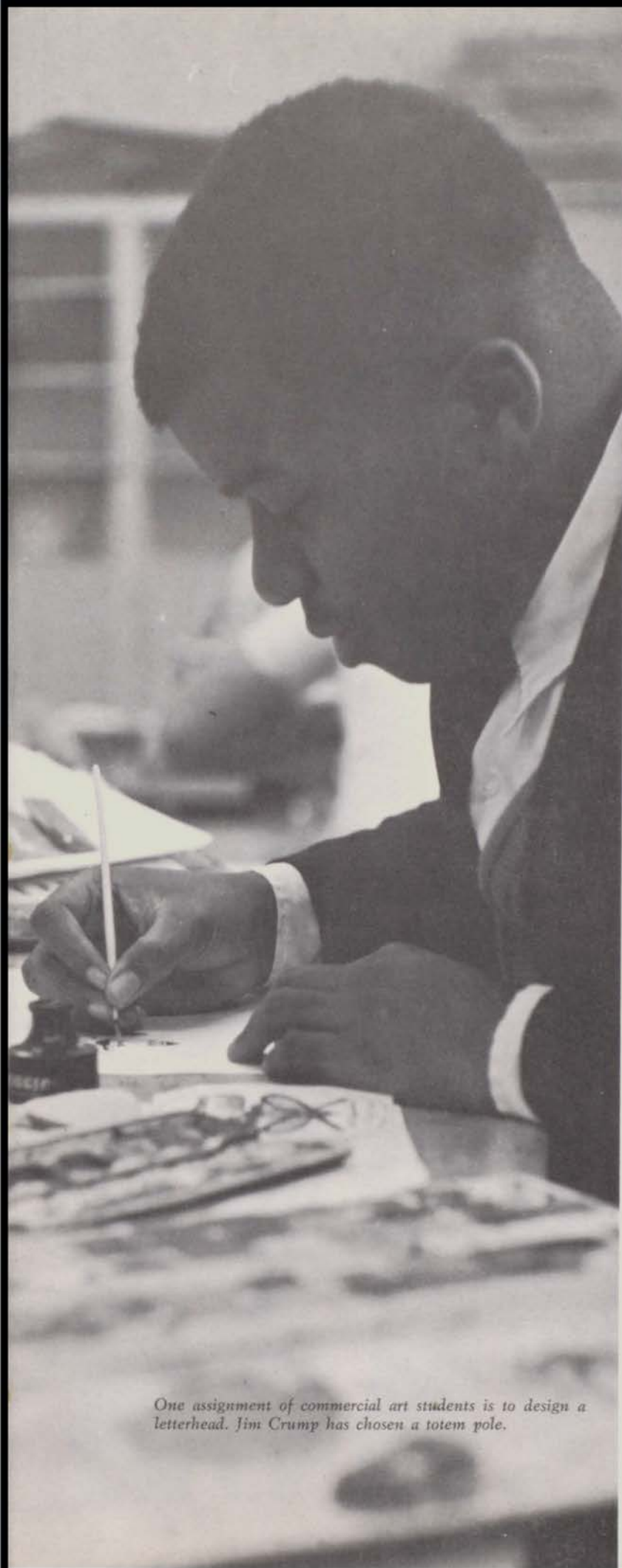
