The Chiefs first win came against Bay City Handy. Halfback Karl Williams put Central on the scoreboard when he returned a Handy punt, 75 yards, for the games only touchdown, giving PCH a 7-0 victory.















We've got the Spirit!







The Sound of Music





The music department offers a program appealing to varied interests, with classes ranging from theory to band. Music reading is stressed in most of the courses.




Artistic Endeavor Aroused

The more advanced art courses instruct those who are interested in making art a lifetime occupation by encouraging individual research and improvement in freehand and design skills.





For the student who plans on continuing his education, the department offers electronics and architectural drawing.



Co-op

Cooperative training affords the student the opportunity to put formal, inschool instruction to practical use. The student is employed on a part-time basis and is paid according to the wage scale for beginning employees. Work is closely supervised by the employer and the school coordinator. In addition to the instruction and experience received on the job, these students receive in-school instruction in subjects closely related to the work done on the job. Students receive regular credit each semester and must spend a minimum of fifteen hours per week on the job. Students who participate in this cooperative, on-the-job training program receive practical experience that cannot be provided in the school.
