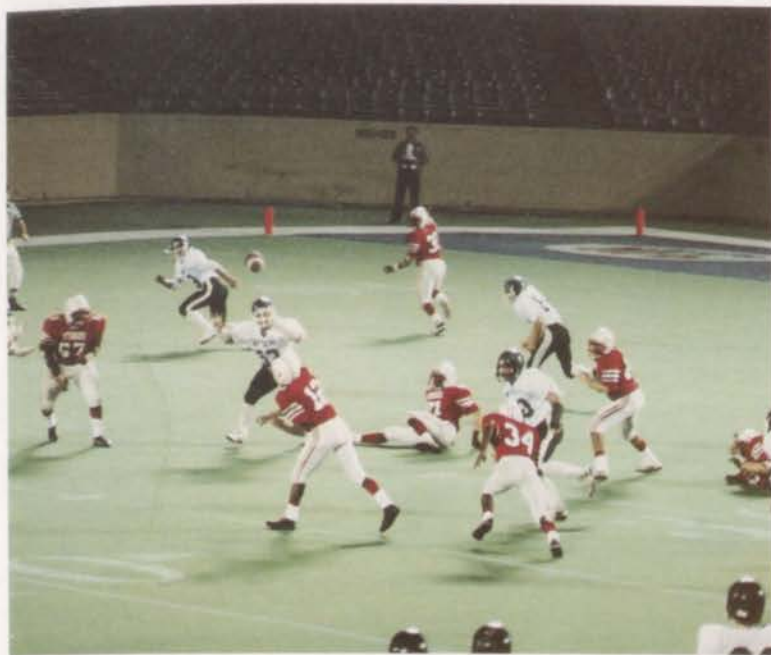


1983-1984 Homecoming Court

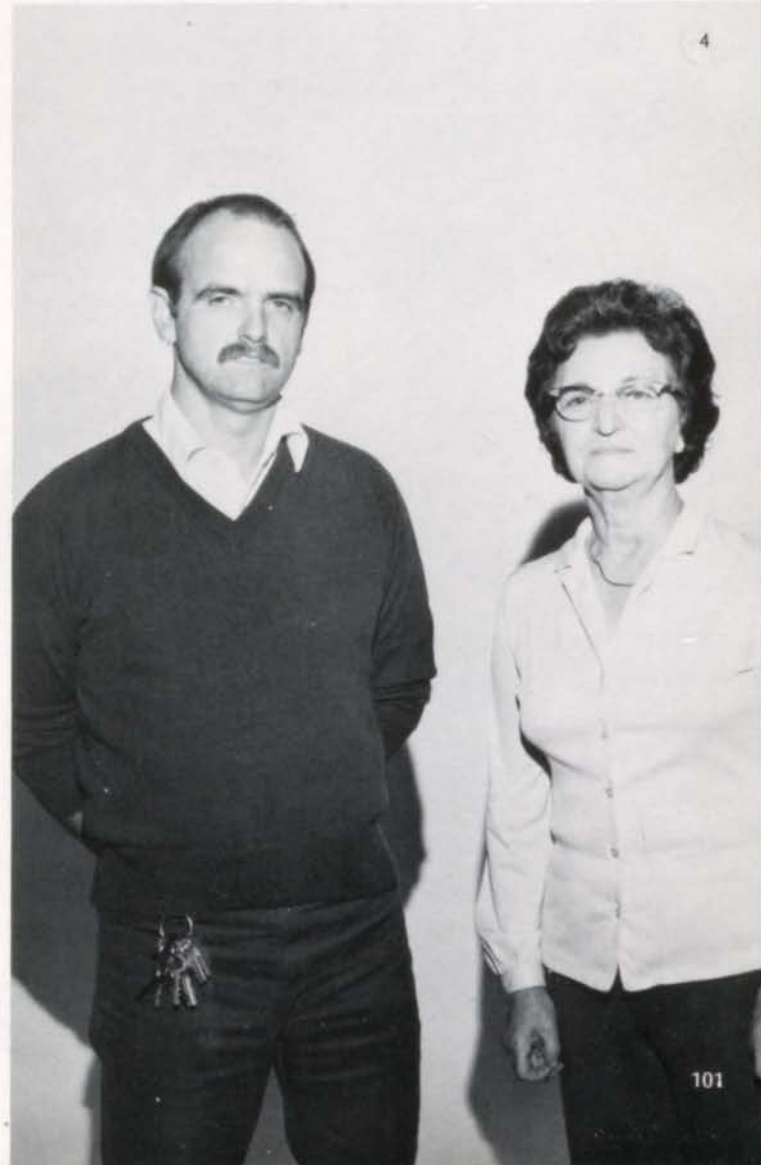


Maintenance And Officer Walker
