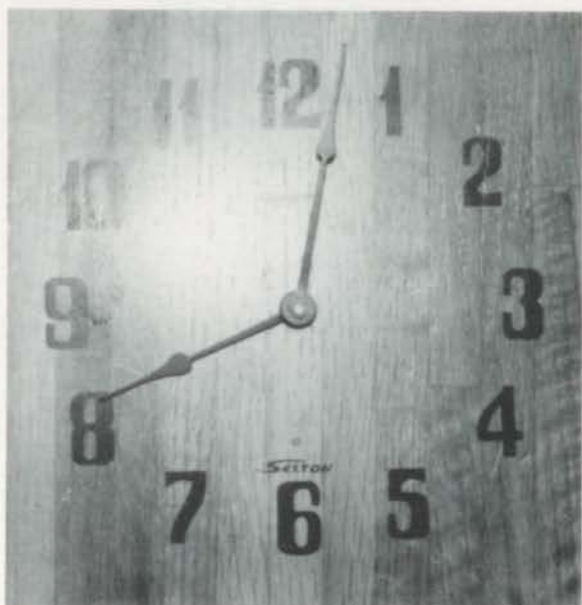
As we pause to look at the Huskie Fashion we find that Northern has a unique sense of variety in clothing. There are many different styles, favorites, and fads. From toes to bleached

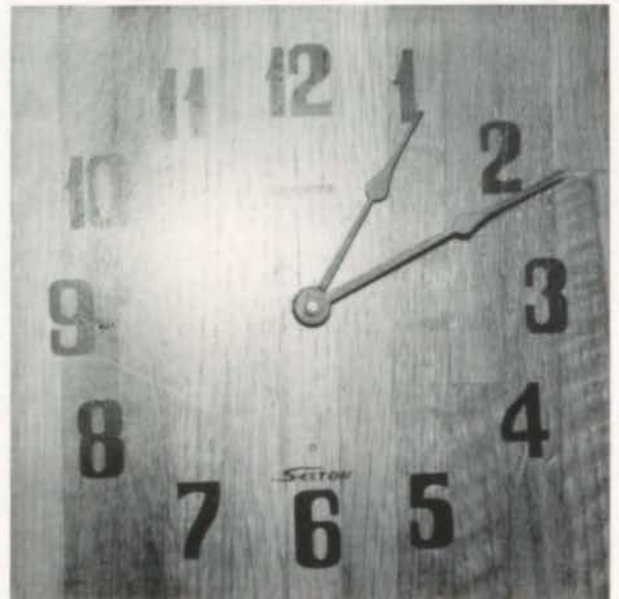




PNH...THE EYE OPENER

our feet and we won the City Championship with a score of 16 to 42.



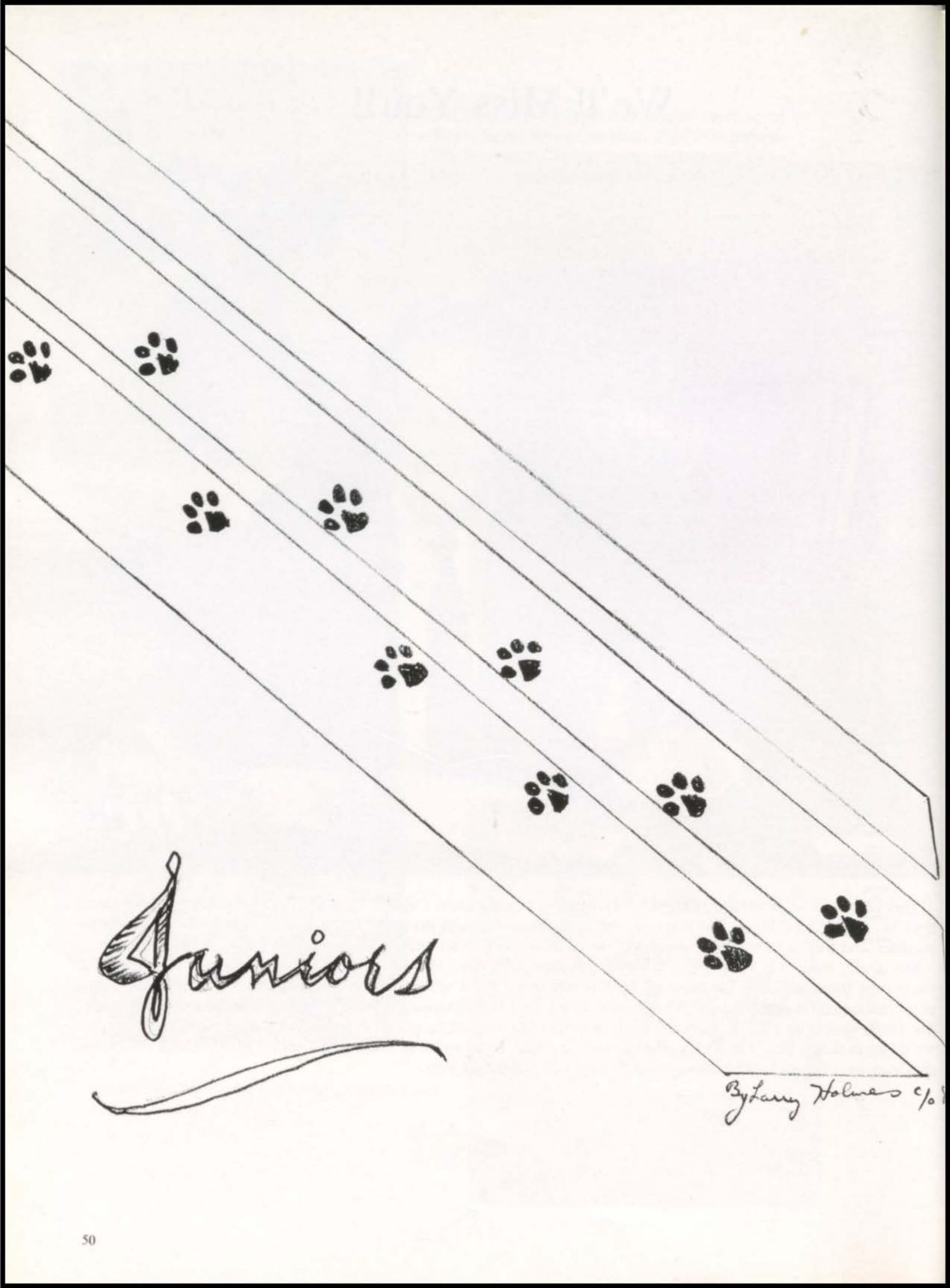

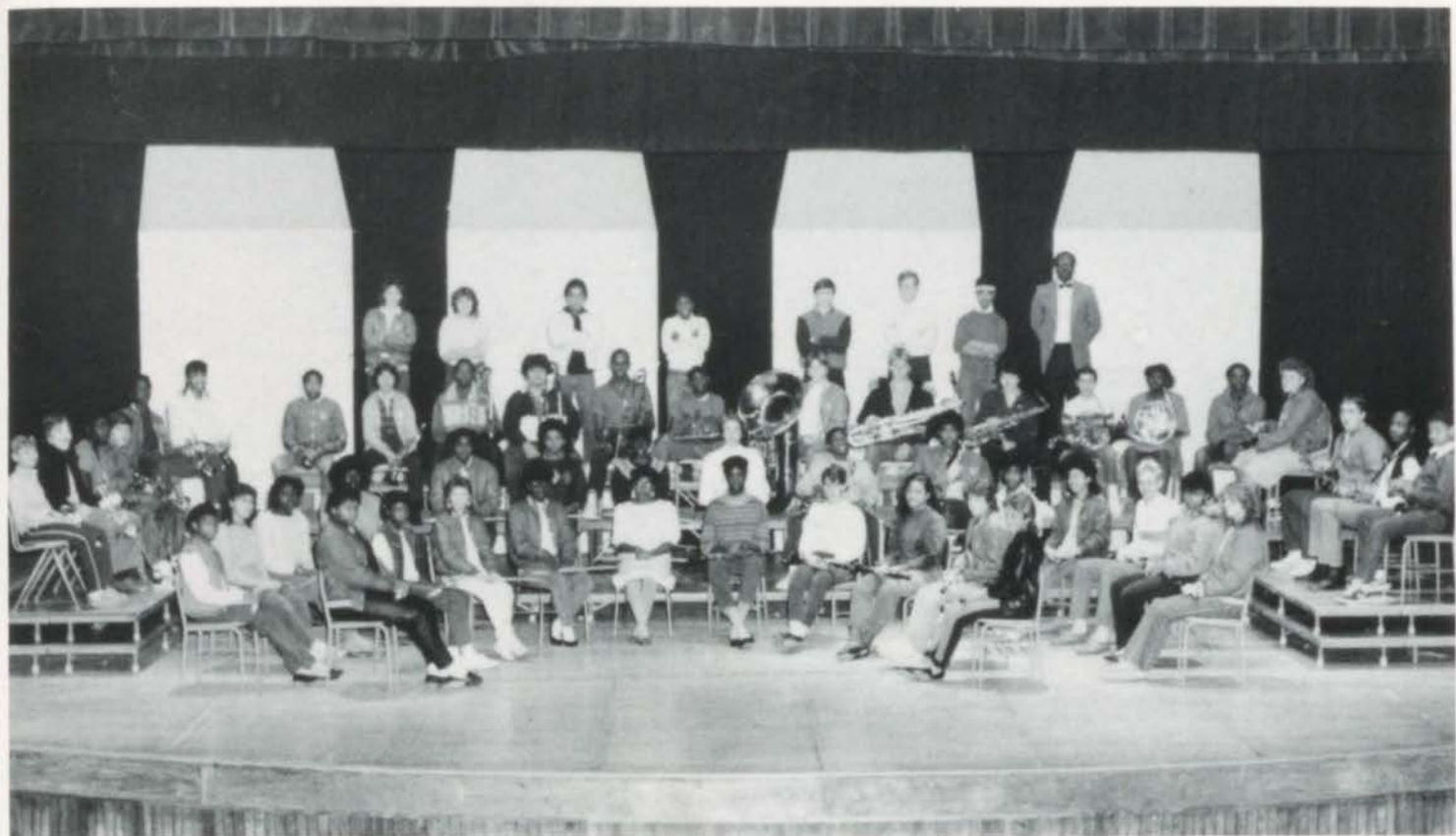
Musically Talented Voices
